

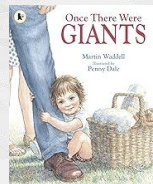
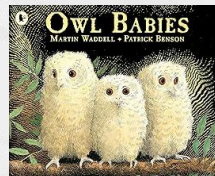
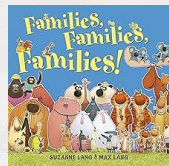
Autumn 1 in Nursery



Literacy

Pupils will be encouraged to sit and listen to short stories and to be able to talk about the pictures or retell the story. They will be encouraged to develop their communication and to speak in simple sentences.

Maths

Number and counting.

Pupils will be encouraged to join in with counting rhymes such as 1,2,3,4,5, once I caught a fish alive. They will be comparing, sorting, matching and naming colours. They will be comparing sizes and will be taught how to continue a pattern. The children will also be encouraged to recite number names in order and to begin to count one object a time.

Learning Adventure

Me and my community

This project supports children with settling into the new rules & routines of school & encourage them to make new friends & feel confident in their class. It teaches them about being helpful, kind & thoughtful at home & at school. This project also teaches children how they are unique and special, the importance of friendship & how many people are in their family, school & local community are important & can help them.

Exploring Autumn

This project teaches children about natural changes that happen during the Autumn, including how the weather changes, why trees lose their leaves & how wild animals prepare for winter.

PSED

The pupils will be encouraged to Manage their own needs, for example, putting their own coat on and washing their own hands.

The pupils will be encouraged to sit quietly for a short amount of time, listen carefully & follow simple instructions. They will also be encouraged to share and be kind to their peers and adults in the classroom. The children will also be encouraged to use their manners by saying please and thank you.

Music

My Stories

This music project will allow pupils to listen to and play instruments to songs. Pupils will be learning songs about their bodies.

We will be learning and singing a variety of nursery rhymes such as 'one, two, three, four, five, once I caught a fish alive. Baa, Baa Black sheep, Insy winsy spider, Humpty dumpty & I'm a little teapot.'

Physical Development

Gross motor

Pupils will experiment with different ways of moving the body & begin to use large muscle movements to wave flags/streamers.

Fine motor

Pupils will use tools for different purposes, they will develop their skills to snip with scissors, hold tools & equipment correctly showing a preference for a dominant hand.
