## Uniform Policy

### **Rationale**

When children are in school they are part of a community and by wearing a school uniform we aim to promote a feeling of equality, partnership and belonging. We therefore strongly encourage the wearing of our school uniform.

## Aims

Through the wearing of a school uniform we aim to:

- Create a sense of community and belonging within our school
- Promote a sense of pride in the school
- Make children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance
- Ensure that the clothing worn in school is practical and smart

## Expectations

Children are expected to wear school uniform. Sweatshirt tops and polo shirts can be ordered through the school or purchased from Brad Sports.

**Jewellery & Religious items of Clothing.**
