#### **REMINDERS AND UPDATES:**

#### **Morning and End of Day**

A reminder that start and finish times are as follows:

Start at 8:45am, Finish at 11:45am (30 hour children—finish at 3:20pm) **Nursery:** 

#### **Reception**—Year 6: Start at 8:50am, Finish at 3:20pm

Please ensure that your child attends school every day and is on time for school every morning ready to start learning. It is also just as important that you are on time collecting them at the end of the day. It can be very upsetting for children if parents are not there to collect them when they are expected to, and our teaching staff have other commitments after school so are unable to stay and look after any children who have not been collected on time.

We will still be closely monitoring all absences and late arrivals/collections. Parents will be issued with warning letters once any child's attendance reaches below our expected attendance level of 95%. We will also be implementing a charge for late collections as per the letter sent to all parents on 17th November.

#### Illness

If your child is too ill to attend school, please ensure that you inform us by phoning the school office before 9.15am on each day of illness.

If your child has sickness or diarrhoea, they cannot return to school until they have had 48 hours clear from the last episode of any vomiting or diarrhoea.

A reminder that your child should NOT have medication of any type in school with them. If your child needs to have any medicine whilst at school, you must sign it in at the school office and it will be kept safe until your child needs to have it administered. Please note that we can only administer prescribed medication. If you wish to come into school to give your child any other medication, please contact the school office.

#### **PE Days**

All children will have a PE lesson each week as follows. The lessons will be led by our Sports Coaches from Soccer 2000.

Year 1 and Year 2:	Monday

Year 5 & Year 6:	Thursday	

In addition to the above set days, all classes will also have other PE activities throughout each week so please ensure that every child brings their PE kit in each Monday morning and takes it home for washing each Friday.

ALL pupils will need to follow the school's PE uniform requirements. This will be monitored closely and you will be informed if your child is not in the correct PE kit. Children who are not wearing the correct kit or unsuitable kit will not be allowed to take part in the lessons for health and safety reasons.

#### **After School Club**

Our After School Childcare Club is available at a cost of just £6.00 per session. The session starts when the school bell rings at 3:20pm and finishes at 5.15pm. There will be a small snack and drink provided to the children daily.

The children at Bushbury Lane have been well and truly hooked into their new Learning Adventure topics this term. Across the school, exciting 'engage days' took place to introduce our children to their new Geography topics. In Year 1, pupils began their learning journey about our capital city by attending a 'Queens tea party.' The children loved dressing up in their best clothes and enjoyed dancing and eating delicious foods. Furthermore, in Year 4, the children worked collaboratively to make 3D structures of mountains, whilst children in Year 6 built 'base camps' to prepare for an expedition to the polar regions. Throughout the half term, pupils across the school have developed their Geographical skills and knowledge and we are very proud of the progress they have made.



#### Reading

At Bushbury Lane Academy, we value reading as a key life skill and believe that reading is pivotal for academic success, which is what we aspire towards for all of our children.

Reading is a top priority in our school and is an important driver throughout all areas of our curriculum. Ultimately through our reading curriculum, it is our intention for all our pupils to establish and appreciation and love of reading; develop their knowledge of the world around them; learn and utilise new vocabulary and enhance their comprehension skills.

#### Phonics and early reading

We teach early reading for EYFS and KS1 using the Read Write Inc scheme, which teaches children to read, write and spell with a focus on Phonics. We teach phonics in small group lessons, so that all children have access to teaching, which provides an appropriate challenge in relation to age related expectations. At the end of each half term, our children are assessed and following on from this are allocated groups, that match their ability.

#### **VIPERS**

Reading skills for KS1 and KS2 are taught in whole class lessons, to allow all children access to the skills and knowledge contained in the National Curriculum. Reading lessons take place several times a week for the children at Bushbury Lane and are focused around an aged appropriate, high quality text- which changes every half term. Within the lessons, our pupils are given the opportunity to develop their reading fluency and comprehension skills and all children are given an equal opportunity to succeed against age related expectations. We teach reading through a 6 week reading cycle, where lessons focus on teaching the core principles of 'VIPERS'. (Vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation, retrieval and summary). Each lesson has a reading skill focus introducing new learning or building on prior knowledge.

#### Reading often

Regular reading for children has a huge impact on their academic progress and attainment. Our expectation is that all children read a minimum of 3x a week at home with a parent/carer and that reading is recorded in their reading diary. We will now be tracking how often the pupils are reading on a class interactive reading display and will be rewarding learners in whole school assemblies with bronze, silver and gold certificates linked to the amount of reading they are completing at home. Furthermore, parents and carers now have access to a 'Bushbury Lane parent prompt book,' which provides you with targeted questions to ask your children, whilst reading with them, linked to the VIPERS skills taught during school reading lessons.

#### Encouraging our children to read widely

At Bushbury Lane, we want our children to read books from a range of genres and authors, in order to expose them to different text structures and a range of important themes. To encourage this, we have introduced 'Author study lessons' which form part of their reading journeys in school. Furthermore, we have introduced 'class reading spines' for each class, which include a list of high quality recommended reads that are aged appropriate. The purpose of this is to challenge the children to read as many of the recommended books as possible, so that by the time they leave Bushbury Lane, they have read a wealth of high quality books. We have ensured that all of these books are available for the children in school and are really excited to get this challenge underway.

#### **Punctuality**

We are thankful to those of our parents who get their children to school on time daily but are still concerned that some of our children are continuously arriving to school late every morning and need your support to help this improve. Please see below the significant amount of learning that your children are missing out on. For example, in Year 1—6, we start the school day with our spelling programme. If your child misses the first 15 minutes of school daily, they will never have spelling delivered to them at Bushbury Lane. Your child deserves to access these lessons.
