### <u>Writing</u>

<u>The Snail and The</u> Whale

Pupils will take part in many engaging and Creative activities to link with their new story of The Snail and the Whale. We will be making observations on the front cover, discussing Characters and their most familiar author, Julia Donaldson. We will look at how her stories are written with lots of rhyming words. Children will read the story and retell by acting out the story and sequencing.

# The Very Hungry Caterpillar

Children will be making observations about the front cover, predicting and sequencing the story to gain fluency. Children will also discuss Eric Carle – the author of the story.

Maths

#### Shape

Children will begin to learn their 2-d shapes. We will start by going on a shape hunt and looking at the different shapes we can spot in our indoor and outdoor area. Children will be looking at different shapes and discussing the different properties and what makes them the same and different. We will also spend some time looking at where objects move and their positions. Children will learn positional language vocabulary such as on top, behind, under and next to.

#### Number and counting

Children will continue to familiarise themselves with numbers 1-5. Children will be able to recognise different amounts using different objects and be able to compare and talk about them in length to gain an understanding about each number. We will move onto the composition of these numbers, recalling number facts of how to make certain numbers by adding. Children will be forming these numbers and practicing recognising the numerals and the amounts.
